










The global cultural map II, 2008









The global cultural map III, 2015




Cultural Map Development 1981-2014




Changes between 1981 – 2014




Changes between 1994 – 2014




Most people can be trusted - time series

The Rule of Law Index

Measures how the rule of law is experienced by 100.000 households and 2400 expert surveys, **102 countries**, 2015



Rank score for the 8 categories:

- Constraints on government powers
- Absence of corruption
- Open Government
- Fundamental rights
- Order & Security
- Regulatory Enforcement
- Civil justice
- Criminal justice



The Open Government Index

Measures government openness based on the general public's experiences and perceptions worldwide,


102 countries



Rank score for the 4 categories:

- Publicized laws & government data
- Right to information
- Civic participation
- Complaint mechanisms






Emancipative Values - measured through 4 sub-indices




- Autonomy: Children qualities independence, imagination, obedience
- Equality: Men priority to jobs, uni-education, political leadership
- **Choice**: Justifiable homosexuality, abortion, divorce
- Voice: 4 pm-index freedom of speech, influence on government, workplace and community








Emancipative Values - time series




Autonomy Index, Nordic/Baltic: Child qualities




(V19+V21)-(V12+V18) Important child qualities: Religious Faith+Obedience vs. Independence+Determination, Perseverance

Child quality by language - Estonia




Equality Index, Nordic/Baltic: - men's priority to jobs, education and leadership







